#### II. BACKGROUND

The TPB, in its commitment in pursuing green and sustainable tourism, included in the Corporation's annual work program the conduct of CSR programs. These programs aim to create green and environment awareness; that shall result to a greater respect and a deeper appreciation of nature and Filipino culture and heritage; not only to its participants but also to tourism stakeholders and most importantly to future generations who will greatly benefit from these projects.

For 2018's second official segment, 19 TPB personnel were selected to join the CSR Banaue leg. Volunteers in partnership with Mr. Mon Corpuz of Black Pencil Project, were involved in different initiatives such as adoption of rice terraces, stone walling activity, mural painting at Cambulo Elementary School and distribution of 358 set of school supplies to Cambulo, Mataw (Cambulo Annex) and Pula Elementary Schools.

Before leaving for Banaue, the CPBD Department, the organizer of all CSR programs, have conducted a briefing with the volunteers together with Mr. Mon Corpuz, to inform them of the line-up of activities, do's and don'ts and things to bring during the visit to Banaue.

### IV. HIGHLIGHTS OF CSR BANAUE

For this particular leg of the CSR Program, the volunteers were able to engage in activities that gave importance to:

### 1. Environmental sustainability

### Adoption of Rice Terraces

The TPB volunteers went for almost 1 and a half hours of jeepney ride and a 30 minutes trek to visit the area.

For this year's Banaue leg, Cambulo Village was the selected beneficiary of the CSR activities. In lieu of restoration of rice terraces since it is already funded by the village, the amount allocated will be used for the restoration of one of the Ifugao house to serve as visitor's information counter.

### Stone Walling Activity

The community of Banaue, especially the Ifugao farmers recognizes the importance of rice terraces to boost their tourism. Rice terraces in Banaue were frequently called "Eight Wonder of the World". It has been declared by the Philippine government as a National Cultural Treasure under Ifugao rice terraces by the virtue of Presidential Decree No. 260 in 1973.

The TPB employees, through Bayanihan, created a six-storey stone wall to prevent the deterioration of one of the Banaue rice terraces.

### Mural Painting

Led by Ms. Nini Sacro, founder of Climb Against Cancer Pilipinas and a member of Black Pencil Project, the TPB volunteers unleashed their creativity skills through mural painting with three (3) panels of 4 x 10 plywood which was benefited by Cambulo Elementary School stage.

### 2. Giving back to marginalized members of our community

### Provision and distribution of school supplies to Cambulo, Mataw (Cambulo Annex) and Pula Elementary School

The TPB CSR partner, Mr. Mon Corpuz, founder of Black Pencil Project, recommended the Cambulo, Mataw (Cambulo Annex) and Pula Elementary Schools to be the recipients of the school supplies. The TPB volunteers joined the celebration of the 10<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary of Sheer-Voluntourism of the Black Pencil Project in Cambulo Village. The Officials of Cambulo, together with the teachers and selected students of Cambulo Elementary School expressed their gratitude through a cultural presentation and song numbers in their own dialect. After the school supplies distribution, a photo opportunity took place and Ms. Marivic Sevilla, TPB CSR Team Leader, formally handed the donation for the restoration of one Ifugao house as visitor's information counter in the village.

The TPB brought 358 sets of school supplies which comprised of bags, notebooks, pad papers, pencils, ball pens, ruler, crayons, luggage tag and lanyard which can be used for one school year. A feeling of accomplishment was collectively felt among the TPB volunteers after seeing the smiles and appreciation from the students and teachers of Cambulo, Mataw and Pula Elementary School.

## V. HOSTING / SPONSORSHIP

- Assistance from Mr. Mon Corpuz as official partner and coordinator for the arrangement with Cambulo Village officials and elders
- Assistance from Ms. Nini Sacro in arranging the mural painting and preparation of a soup kitchen for the children
- Assistance from teachers of Cambulo Elementary School in the preparation of meals and provision of the venue.
- Assistance from LGU through the officials of Cambulo Village
  - Orientation on the process of stone walling
  - Assistance from Ifugao farmers during the conduct of stone walling activity
  - Provision of stones materials

# VI. ISSUES AND CONCERNS/ OBSERVATIONS

- Banaue is not only about the rice terraces and its landscape views. Although modernization reached them, their rich culture and hospitality of the Ifugaos are very visible, still wearing their native attire and chewing "moma" at present are proof of that.
- CSR Banaue volunteers were very cooperative in all activities and scheduled set by the project officer. They were also proactively participative and showed their determination while doing the activities.
- Originally, the venue for the lunch is supposed to be in San Jose, Nueva Ecija but due to time restrain, the team decided to have lunch in Santa Fe, Nueva Vizcaya before traveling along Dalton Pass where the team experienced almost five (5) hours of traffic due to vehicular accident.

# VII. RESULT OF POST-EVENT SURVEY

As the program ended, participants were requested to evaluate the CSR Banaue activity.

89% of the volunteers were surveyed, the following are the results:

### A. Social Relevance



Under Social Relevance category, majority of the volunteers have strongly agreed that the CSR activities done led to greater respect for nature and greater appreciation of local & cultural heritage.



### **B. Project Officer**

The majority of the volunteers have strongly agreed that the project officer met the requirements during the implementation of the program. Meanwhile, 6% of the volunteers disagreed that the project officer entertained and ensured the understanding of the participants.

### C. Itinerary/Activities



For Itinerary/Activities category, majority of the volunteers have strongly agreed that the activities set are interesting, enjoyable and new. Despite and inspite of minor deviations has occurred.



### D. Self-Assessment

The volunteers assessed themselves after the CSR Banaue program, majority of them said that they were participative, and cooperative and that they practiced proper behavior at all times. On the other hand, 65% have strongly disagreed and 35% have disagreed that they did not enjoy the program.

## E. Overall Rating



82% of the surveyed volunteers have strongly agreed that they find the CSR Banaue worth taking. Meanwhile, 94% intend to participate in the future CSR activities.

There are also points stressed by the participants:

- TPB should provide seminar regarding CSR to tourism stakeholders to adapt the same advocacy;
- Consideration on the weather condition prior heading to designated area for the safety of everyone, and;
- The importance of simple living, conservation of energy/electricity and waste segregation.

### VIII. RECOMMENDATIONS

- It is recommended to continuously include this activity in the future CSR Program, particularly to far-flung areas in the Province of Ifugao who rarely receive assistance from the government.
- Long term partnership with selected or identified NGOs to have more effective CSR project/activities.
- To consider provision of any sports equipment aside from school supplies for the children, provision of Philippine Flag and conducting a livelihood program for both men and women of the community
- Full emersion such as living plainly with the community, activities with the children such as mini games/tournament and sharing of the

importance of waste management, as well as the preservation of culture and architectural design of houses/facilities.

 The TPB can consider conducting awareness campaign or preparing a presentation about CSR for LGUs and tourism stakeholders in order to have the same advocacy and provide broader information of the importance of sustainable tourism.

### IX. Sterris

- Environmental and cultural awareness among volunteers of the CSR activity that will help in the individual appreciation of the importance of green tourism that will hopefully transcend to their respective circle of friends and families;
- Building relationship and networking with the local communities, LGU, tourism stakeholders and even amongst TPB employees who are also possible and potential partners and donors for future TPB CSR projects;
- Additional first-hand knowledge of the country's tourism products and services that will hopefully help them become more productive personnel of the Corporation;
- Articles to be published through the assistance of MARCOM (including online postings on TPB social media accounts) and invited bloggers.
- Documentary stories to feature on TPB website and other social media accounts.

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
