

## **TERMINAL REPORT**

# CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CSR) 2021-3<sup>rd</sup> Leg: Community Assistance to Community Assistance to Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC), Philippine General Hospital (PGH) and Museo Pambata

23 September and 04 November 2021

## I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

To provide unhampered service amidst the surge of the COVID-19 cases and the development of the highly contagious SARS-CoV 2 virus strain Delta, PCMC has heightened their healthcare protocols in the hospital by requiring their healthcare staff in non-COVID areas to also use the 3M N95 Particulate Respirator Face Mask. With the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as their only armor against the virus, their supply cannot cover all of their health care workers and PCMC can consume an average of 500 pieces of the face mask daily.

On 24 August 2021, the Tourism Promotions Board's Office of the Chief Operating Officer (OCOO) received an email from the Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC)'s Office of Strategy Management requesting for 3M N95 Particulate facemasks/respirators and TPB responded by donating the following:

\*The medical supplies were delivered on **03 November 2021** at the TPB and were inspected by Ms. Jem Cangco of Budget Division.

TPB has also donated 1,500 pieces of destination postcards with colored pens on 23 September 2021 to the pediatric ward of the Philippine General Hospital (PGH) and to the visitors Museo Pambata, as well as the beneficiaries of the museum's charity project that happens every December of every year.



PCMC's pediatric ward has also received 500 pieces of the same promo materials along with the medical supplies mentioned above on 04 November 2021. The items were received by Ms. Shalimar P. Abalos, PCMC's Donation Coordinator.

## II. BACKGROUND

The Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC) is one of the Government Owned and Controlled Corporate National Centers for Specialized Health Care under the Department of Health. It is a 200-bed capacity tertiary hospital and is mandated to provide pediatric care, offer training programs for medical and allied health care providers, and be a center in clinic research. PCMC's mission to deliver the most responsive service remains to be its utmost priority, however, the medical center needs support on their battle against the COVID-19 virus. PCMC is one of the partnered RT-PCR Testing facility providers for the subsidy by DOT/TPB to qualified domestic tourists.

PCMC has heightened their healthcare protocols in the hospital by requiring their healthcare staff in non-COVID areas to also use the 3M N95 Particulate Respirator Face Mask. Although they have sufficient supplies of these masks, it is only allocated for their Health Care Workers, thus PCMC has sent a letter of request to TPB for additional supplies of the said facemask to cover non-health care workers of the medical center.

## III. OBJECTIVES

- To provide aid and support to the healthcare, non-health care workers and patients of Philippine Children's Medical Center;
- To cultivate the culture of giving and volunteerism among TPB personnel; and;
- To comply with GCG Memorandum Circulars 2012-07 and 2015-07 which require GOCCs to include their interaction with communities and other corporate social responsibility activities in their adherence to the Code of Corporate Governance

#### IV. TARGETS AND VOLUNTEERS

Seven (7) TPB employees and three (3) utility personnel were involved in the project.

From the total number of volunteers, two were Female and eight were Male.
